

**Tim Brockett** – Incumbent For South Glastonbury Director

It was an honor and a privilege to serve as Vice President on the 2025 GLA Board of Directors. Led by President Doug Gill our team identified problems and worked tirelessly to seek and implement solutions.

1. Our team raised road maintenance expenditures by 10% while only increasing assessments 3%.
2. Treasurer Claudette Dirkers implemented a streamlined collection process that reduced yearly past due landowners by 33%.
3. The Road Committee saved landowners \$20,000.00 in Spring Grading costs by switching to a Time and Materials contract.
4. I constructed a new GLA website that is secure, contains up to date information, and is widely used by landowners.
5. I built a database and invoicing program that helped streamline the project approval process for landowners and the GLA.
6. Our team addressed dangerous driving conditions by scheduling the widening of narrow roads and the community-wide installation of new safety signs for early September.

My two year term is almost completed. I ask for your vote so I may assist newly elected directors and help returning members of our team build upon their 2025 successes.

2. The Office of the Treasury implemented a streamlined collections process that reduced yearly past-due assessments by 33%.
3. My office worked closely with the Project Review Committee to ensure that all assessments and fees were paid before construction projects could be considered.
4. I inspected road conditions for the Road Committee and helped with safety sign selections.
5. My service on the Governing Documents Committee included researching and drafting language for upcoming Bylaws changes.
6. For the Elections Committee, I assisted with creating nominations and ballot documentation.
7. In my spare time, I edited GLA meeting minutes, newsletters and managed mailings of quarterly assessment statements.
